Topic: Fall Lake Survey

Speaker: Jessica Baumann, Lake Manager for North Carolina State University's Aquatic Plant

Management Program, will be here to discuss the upcoming 2019 fall aquatic vegetation survey.

Every year during the months of September and October, the entire shoreline of Lake Gaston is surveyed for the presence of aquatic plants, both the good and bad. This survey is a collaborative effort between volunteers with the Lake Gaston Association and the Aquatic Plant Management Program at NC State, and is a valuable tool when determining the management plan for Lake Gaston's nuisance species, such as Hydrilla and Lyngbya.

Jessica will be discussing the details of this survey, including training opportunities that will occur prior to the start of the survey. So all levels of experience are welcome to volunteer! If you are interested in participating in this survey please email aquaticplants@ncsu.edu.

Also: Got a lake-related issue or concern that the LGA should be working on? There will be time allotted on the agenda to present those concerns to the LGA Board. And, catch up with what the Committees are working on.

News from the Government Relations Committee

The dust has settled and the County budgets have been approved for FY2019-2020. The local county fiscal year runs from July 1 to June 30. During the budget building process, the LGA provided inputs to all five counties. The information below is our annual posting for each county of the total budget, the ad valorem tax rate, and funding to the Lake Gaston Weed Control Council for noxious weed control.

County	Total Budget (1)	Tax Rate per \$100 (2)	Hydrilla Funding (3)

Mecklenburg, VA	\$121,425,262	\$0.42	\$116K

- (1) Note that Virginia counties are funded differently than North Carolina counties, which results in higher budget totals, but lower ad valorem tax rates.
- (2) Northampton went down half a cent from last year and all other counties stayed the same.
- (3) Northampton went up to \$116K from \$100K last year and all other counties stayed the same.

Volunteers needed for Lake Environment Committee projects

The summer is the busiest time of the year for the Lake Environment Committee. It involves our vegetation project, our ongoing water clarity and E. coli testing and preparing for the Fall lake survey. But much of the time is answering questions from our LGA members.

Most of the questions fall into two categories: Lyngbya and Water Willow. So let's address these two issues up front:

Lyngbya is an algae that grows in shallow water for the most part and likes water that is in back of coves especially.

The Lake Gaston Weed Control Council (LGWCC) has partnered with NCSU to do research, treatment and to determine the best process to rid our lake of this unwanted algae.

Current treatment sites are for the most part same as last year and there are several different chemical recipes being tested. At a meeting last week it was noted that one product was having some success.

So make sure you attend the August 7th meeting to hear our Lake Manager, Jessica Baumann, update us on the treatment effectiveness.

Water Willow is different.

We know how to kill the plant but it is protected by Dominion Energy's Shoreline Management Plan and is specifically pointed out in the FERC license. So if you need relief you will need to contact Dominion Energy. There is nothing we can do to override that part of the agreement with Dominion and the Federal Govt.

Revegetation Project:

We're in the 6th year of the partnership with NC Wildlife and the LGWCC to continue to plant native plants within an enclosure to protect them from herbivores (mostly turtles and grass carp). This year the LGA volunteers who contributed over 150 hours of valuable time teamed up with NC Wildlife, NCSU and Virginia DGIF.

Two new cages were constructed in the Beechwood area and several others repaired and a lot of planting both in and outside the cages. We still have a follow up day in July to finish on some of the Poplar Creek locations. We had several young guys assisting this year. Dylan Cook for his 2nd year and Matthew Woyer, Everett Lynch and Ashton Carroll. It was nice to have young people interested.

Mark Fowlkes is the coordinator for the project and works closely with Jessica from NCSU and of course the LGA. I want to thank Jeff Zimmer for coordinating the effort this year on my behalf since I could not be there.

Anyone interested in assisting in July let us know. Many thanks to John Cataldo, Pete Deschenes and Al Potter for their participation in supplying lunch and getting the work boat via Brunswick County.

Grass Carp:

7,500 grass carp were put into the lake this spring. Two locations received them: Lizard Creek and Hawtree Creek. Each received half. Again the LGWCC in partnership with Dominion Energy is paying for the fish. Remember it is illegal to catch or shoot or have in your possession grass carp on Lake Gaston in both VA and NC.

E. coli/Water Clarity:

Fall Lake Survey:

The plans for the survey are underway with the Lake Environment Committee and NCSU. Be sure to attend the August 7th LGA meeting to gain more insight into the final plan. Last year we had about 65 volunteers. We are hoping to get around 75 this year. If you can contribute 8 hours or more of your valuable time it would be most appreciated.

Comments:

My directorship with the LGA is over at this time. So this is my final report as chairman of the committee. I want to thank all the LGA volunteers over the past 8 or so years for their support with their valuable time. To the members on the committee, each has done a terrific job of assuring our projects are completed on time and in a safe manner I sincerely thank you. We have several tasks that took time to resolve. The time all volunteers contribute is what makes Lake Gaston special.

Enjoy this beautiful time of the year on the water and be safe.

We are now well into the 2019 Hurricane Season and although we have not had any real threats yet, it is a good time to prepare. Each county around the lake has an emergency warning service to alert you of dangers, but the individual needs to visit the county website and signup for the service. You can sign up multiple phones both landlines and cellular phones, and signup for text alerts and/or email.

The information available from the county emergency services offices is local to the county and areas of the affected county. It is also potentially the timeliest source of information tied to a specific address. As a for instance, the counties all receive up to date, accurate weather information from the National Weather Service and the state governments. Dominion Power has the counties' emergency services offices in its notification tree. The Lake Gaston Association will still provide high water warnings and other critical information, but our communication is not as timely as that available through the official emergency services sources.

The E 9-1-1 Task Force has continued its work all around the lake. The Safety Committee has provided assistance where it could and did ensure that the video that was produced is available on the opening page of the LGA website, under latest news. Just click on the title and turn on sound and hit return and the video will play. There is great emphasis on clear, complete information exchange. Calling 9-1-1 on a landline is very effective and provides immediate location data to the E-9-1-1 dispatcher in the county of the physical address. Calling from a cellular phone is far less reliable in reaching the intended call center. Each of the county dispatch centers have a hardline that can be dialed from a cell phone which might be more successful than bouncing off cellular towers. Those numbers are: in Virginia for Brunswick County – (434) 848-3133 and Mecklenburg – (434) 738-6191; and in NC for Halifax – (252) 583-7051, Northampton – (252) 574-1041, and Warren – (252) 257-3456. Remember to speak clearly and provide complete location info.

As we near the end of the most popular season for being at the lake, please start planning for the cold months and coordinate with neighbors so that they can look out for you and you can look out for them. The Fall is when we all need to get into the Watch Out for Our Neighborhood role, and the time to make sure we keep our neighbors in mind when extreme weather strikes. Have cell phone numbers as backups for hardline phones. Check on your neighbors and let them know that you are safe.

Now is the time to schedule needed maintenance on heating systems and ventilation, change the air filters, check the batteries in smoke and carbon monoxide detectors, and get the chimney cleaned. Buy the salt for the walkway and stairs and put it where it is handy to get to.

From the Desk of the Executive Director

One of my favorite tasks to do is pull together our bi-monthly Bulletins. It's definitely a team effort. I couldn't produce the copy without the Committee Chairs articles about what their Committees have been doing since our last Bulletin. As well as the other organizations that provide important information for you.

As you'll see from the front page we have a new President, Don Carson; Mozine Lowe is now our immediate Past President; Brian Goldsworthy is Vice President; Jack Saunders is still Treasurer; and we will need a Secretary to replace Brian, hopefully that will be resolved by our August 7th LGA monthly meeting.

We have seven Committees: Lake Environment, Public Safety, Government Relations, Education, Lake Clean-Up, Marketing & Membership and Nominating (as needed). I get involved in all the committees in one way or another.

For instance, this year Virginia will be holding elections. It's my job to contact both Brunswick and Mecklenburg county General Registrars to get a list of who filed in June for those county positions. The LGA is planning Candidate Forums, probably for early October, for both counties. We also invite State level candidates.

Our Candidate Forums are generally well attended by the candidates as well as the voters. Don Carson has been our moderator for several years now. When the voters arrive for the Forum they have the opportunity to write down their question(s) on 3x5 cards – there are no questions taken from the floor unless they are on a 3x5 card. The 3x5's are vetted before they are given to the Moderator. Voting will occur on November 5.

I have to say I do like to take part in the Lakeside Learning Days that are put on by the Education Committee in the Spring. Each LLD is at a lakeside location and has a local school participate from one of the five counties. They typically have seven stations set up for each group of students to cycle through: normally addressing Hydroelectric Power (LGA), Aquatic Plants (NC State University), Water Analysis (LGA), Lake Fish (VA Department of Games & Inland Fisheries or NC Wildlife); Water Safety (Lake Gaston Water Safety Council); and Buoyancy (LGA). And, at most of the LLDs Adam Fields is available to demonstrate wakeboarding, and he also talks to the students on land.

Each LLD ends up with the opportunity to teach the students how to cast a fishing line. We do not use hooks on the lines as we can have up to 60 or more students. What I like to see is the students that know how to cast a line will stop and help those who are holding a fishing rod for the first time, and nothing is going right for them. Yes, we have fishing rods & bobbers for 60 some students courtesy of Brunswick County who loan them to us when we have a LLD. A great time is had by both the students and their teachers.

If you'd like to volunteer to be on one our committees – they are all very interesting – check out our committee articles and go sit in on one or two of them. You'll see when they meet at the bottom of each article. It's worth a try. How about it?

US Coast Guard Auxiliary Flotilla 93 - 2019 training dates

August 17 • September 21 • October 26

America's Boating Safety Course is an eight hour course covering the basics of boating and is appropriate for youth as well as the adult boater. Successful completion of this course satisfies the education requirement for youth to operate a PWC in both Virginia and North Carolina.

Remember: <u>Virginia now has a law</u> that all boaters in the waters of Virginia will have proof of taking a Boating Course. All Motor Boat Operators operating a vessel with a 10 HP engine or greater, must meet these requirements. All PWC Operators regardless of age must have proof of taking a Boating Course.

North Carolina Law effective January 1, 2014 requires that all PWC and Motor Boat Operators who were born after 1 Jan 1988 will have proof of taking a Boating Course, if they are operating a vessel with a 10 HP engine or greater.

Clarification: Boaters on Lake Gaston need to be in compliance with their state of residence for Boater Education Certification. This is true whether the boater is a resident of North Carolina, Virginia, or any other state as recognized by both states' enforcement officers.

The fee for the course is \$30.00, **Preregistration and prepayment are required.** Courses are now taught at the Long Bridge VFD, 1678 Eaton Ferry Rd., Littleton, NC 27850. All classes are on Saturday from 8:30am to 5:00pm, with the exam given at the end of class.

Please bring your lunch. Bottled water and sodas can be purchased for 50 cents. It is a busy day - but rewarding. Remember – **Preregistration and Prepayment are required.**

Lake Gaston Water Safety Council news

Information was recently provided by the NC Wildlife Commission about boating fatalities in 2018. The bottom line number is striking! "A total of 35 people lost their lives due to boating accidents last year, the highest number of vessel-related fatalities since 1990. Twenty-nine of the victims were not wearing a life vest", according to NC Wildlife.

While we think awareness is up, it would seem too many believe it can't happen. As manufacturers work to make life jackets more wearable and look jazzy, someone near the water still needs to pick it up and wear it. We all know the time to put a life jacket on is not when you are in the water.

So what to do. It's got to be a rule and if you are the skipper of your boat, walk the talk and practice what you preach. Some good rules to live by and remember include:

- Wear a Coast Guard-approved Personal Flotation Device (PFD) or a life jacket at all times when boating or on a personal watercraft. The Coast Guard advises a properly fitted life jacket is snug, yet comfortable, will not move above the chin or ears when lifted by the shoulders.
- Throw, don't go. Be prepared to throw a floatation device or use a pole/tree branch to reach someone struggling in the water. Never jump in to save someone because you too could be pulled under.
- Our Coast Guard Auxiliary Flotilla 9-3 offers a Safe Boating Class. Look for their link and more water safety information at www.LakeGastonWaterSafetyCouncil.com.

Barricade of Boats - Get the Best View of the Event on August 10

To help protect the participants in *The Crossing*, Eaton Ferry Bridge will be closed to all water traffic, and security vessels from the US Coast Guard Auxiliary Flotilla 93, NC Wildlife, the Warren County Sheriff, and the Coast Guard will be there to enforce this closing.

Additionally, a barricade of boats from the public are welcome to line up near the swim lane buoys to protect the participants. Anyone interested in being a part of the 'barricade' should just come out and be in position on the west side of the bridge behind the line of buoys, with your boat anchored, prior to 8:30 a.m.

The barricade boats will have a bird's eye view of the event – as well as being a part of the protection for the participants. An anchor is a **MUST** – you cannot idle your motors near the swim lane! We do not want any boat waves or engine exhaust to impact the swimmers.

Barricade boats must be in position prior to the bridge closing at 8:30 a.m., and *The Crossing* event kicks off at 9:00 a.m. and is usually over by 11:30 a.m.
