President's Corner

An Earthquake Can Really Wake You Up

Luly and I recently spent some time in Puerto Rico helping take care of some family business. During our stay, the island was hit with a series of earthquakes. The first one, at 4 in the morning, jolted us awake. Alarmed and suddenly fearful that the building around us might collapse, we rushed out of the building and joined neighbors for an hour or so of pre-dawn commiserating in the parking lot. As things seemed to have settled, we returned to try get some rest before the day began.

Shortly after we finally dozed off, we were rocked again at 6 a.m. by another big one. The power went out (island wide as we found out later) and we were up for the day. Long story short, we and the family are safe and our homes intact (as of this writing) and power and water have been restored for most everyone. We each now keep a "Bug Out" bag by the door in case we need to evacuate quickly.

We were fortunate in that we were located on the far side of the island from the origin of the quake. Its effect there was less that the on the south coast, closer to the source. That part of the island suffered significant damage to homes, buildings, roads, bridges, and other infrastructure.

Our business in Puerto Rico required multiple trips across and around the island. Although we avoided the hardest hit locales, our travels did take us by some of the significantly affected areas, as well as, some emergency tent camps set up for the folks who cannot return to their homes.

The other thing we witnessed was caravans of fellow citizens carrying supplies to affected areas. We passed caravans varying in size from 20 to 40 cars and trucks filled with materials needed immediately to help those in need. Churches and civic groups organized collection points to aggregate donations from individuals to be transported to those in need. It was an amazing display of volunteer response at a local level.

This really drove home the sense of community across the island, where people are taking care of people in need.

Fortunately, we aren't as likely to by hit by earthquakes and hurricanes here in the Lake Gaston area, though we have our share of snow and ice storms (see what the Safety Committee recommends for that). There are however many areas where we need to take care of our own and it is helping out that makes this a Community. These areas may not make the front page headlines, and sometimes that it makes it easier to just stay home.

The facts are that there is more need for people to help out in our community than there are people volunteering. Volunteer organizations across the country are all in need of more folks who can donate a little of their time.

The Lake Gaston Association is one of those organizations. Our membership is growing, thank you all, but our volunteers are dwindling (and aging!). Our by-laws provide for 25 Directors. Directors are usually members who participate in a couple of our committees.

Back in the day, we had a full slate of Directors representing all five counties around the Lake. We had term limits for Directors to force turnover so more folks could be Directors. Over the years, we have gone down to roughly half that number of Directors. This year, we will be voting to modify those term limits to allow Directors who wish to serve longer to stay on board!

Our biggest need, however, is more volunteers on our committees. We get lots of feedback on how well we are doing and we thank you for that. The problem is fewer and fewer volunteers are doing this great work.

For those of you who volunteer in your community, I extend a hearty thank you. For others, I urge you to consider giving a little of your time to support this great community that we are a part of.

2019 Fall Vegetation Survey results

60 volunteers participated this past fall to survey the entire 350 miles of Lake Gaston shoreline. This was a tremendous effort and "hats off" to all those who participated.

Over 6,000 sample points were taken. Jessica Bauman, Extension Associate for Lake Gaston with NC State University's Aquatic Plant Management Program has analyzed the data and created a report which is in the DRAFT stage. Some highlights are that approximately ¾ of the shoreline is vegetated with primarily emergent species. Water willow continues to be the greatest component. Hydrilla is still located throughout the lake, but sites are small and patchy. Results on the presence of Lyngbya are somewhat mixed with some areas showing an increase and others a decrease.

These results along with other data are being shared with the Lake Gaston Weed Control Council and the Technical Advisory Group or TAG. The TAG will be making recommendations for integrated management such as Grass Carp stocking levels and Aquatic Herbicide treatment plans.

Members of the LGA Lake Environment Committee have been active participants in this management process and the LGA contribution to the Fall Vegetation Survey is recognized.

Thanks again to all the volunteers, too numerous to mention, who contributed to this effort. You are helping keep our lake environment healthy!

Other Lake Committee Activities ...

We will continue to provide LGA volunteers with E.coli water test equipment. Over 85 tests were conducted in 2019. Several potential problem areas were identified and responsible parties took remedial action. We plan to continue these efforts and will report results out later this year.

Plans are underway to survey the vegetation exclosures or cages for plant growth and needed upkeep this spring. Our focus this summer will be repair existing cages as needed and expand plantings outside and around the cages. This work will take place in June and is another great opportunity for volunteers to contribute to improving our lake environment.

Be Prepared! A message from the Public Safety Committee:

Many local residents have installed alarm systems and cameras which have reduced burglaries recently. Neighborhoods are placing security cameras around their subdivision entryways as a successful deterrent to thieves. As we learned from law enforcement, at the five county forum, thieves like the job to be easy, your job is to make it difficult. Some robberies occur from water access so don't forget security lights and cameras at your dock!

There is a good chance icy and snowy weather is still likely to hit, with the potential for high wind and wet weather causing damage and injuries. Get ready by getting the supplies and salt for deicing before the storm occurs, secure loose items on decks and docks, and put an extra case of water in the garage.

Other helpful tips:

Check/replace batteries in smoke and carbon monoxide detectors. If it's difficult to replace them, contact your local firefighters; they would rather help avoid a crisis.

Scammers continue to target the unsuspecting and trusting person. Never respond to the calls, emails, tests, or inquiries that compromise your privacy and security. Social security numbers, Medicare ID numbers, driver's license, credit card numbers should be safeguarded by you. If there is a question about your Accounts, you should initiate contact with the government agency or business directly to ensure you reach a trusted contact.

When writing checks this year, use the date 2020. If you use "20" instead, it can be easily altered.

When using a debit card always get the receipt when they ask if you want it. Charges can be added afterwards if you don't.

Research the charities soliciting money from you to ensure they are valid. Reputable charities should spend 80% to 90% on donation income on delivering services rather than fund salaries, facilities and advertising.

US Coast Guard Auxiliary Flotilla 93 - 2020 training dates

March 14, April 18, May 9, June 6, July 18, August 22, Sept 26, Oct 17

America's Boating Safety Course is an eight hour course covering the basics of boating and is appropriate for youth as well as the adult boater. Successful completion of this course satisfies the education requirement for youth to operate a PWC in both Virginia and North Carolina.

Remember: <u>Virginia now has a law</u> that all boaters in the waters of Virginia will have proof of taking a Boating Course. All Motor Boat Operators operating a vessel with a 10 HP engine or greater, must meet these requirements. All PWC Operators regardless of age must have proof of taking a Boating Course.

North Carolina Law effective January 1, 2014 requires that all PWC and Motor Boat Operators who were born after 1 Jan 1988 will have proof of taking a Boating Course, if they are operating a vessel with a 10 HP engine or greater.

Clarification: Boaters on Lake Gaston need to be in compliance with their state of residence for Boater Education Certification. This is true whether the boater is a resident of North Carolina, Virginia, or any other state as recognized by both states' enforcement officers.

The fee for the course is \$30.00, **Preregistration and prepayment are required.** Courses are now taught at the Long Bridge VFD, 1678 Eaton Ferry Rd., Littleton, NC 27850. All classes are on Saturday from 8:30am to 5:00pm, with the exam given at the end of class.

Please bring your lunch. Bottled water and sodas can be purchased for 50 cents. It is a busy day - but rewarding. Remember – **Preregistration and Prepayment are required.**
